## President's Report

The 2021 competition season was a vast improvement on 2020 in terms of games completed and our results on the field. There were a few bumps along the way, particularly towards the end, but most rounds were completed.

I would like to again acknowledge the work of the Queensland Rugby Union and the Brisbane Junior Rugby Union for navigating a path through the season. Gaven Head (GM Community Rugby) from the QRU and all the club managers once again worked tirelessly to ensure we were able to get through another tough planning year.

This year we had nine senior teams take the field for the Magpies with 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th grades all making finals. Unfortunately, 5ths dropped out in the first week of the finals going down to Easts 22 to 10. In a Friday night game at the nest, in front of a great crowd, 6th Grade took out the Grand Final in a thriller – 14 to 12 over Wests. The next day at Sunnybank 4ths and 3rds went close, going down to GPS and Brothers respectively in their Grand Final Games.

The last game of the day at Sunnybank was another edge of your seat match with 2nds grinding out a 31 to 27 win over UQ.

Congratulations to all involved in those teams, and all others who took the field in the black and white this year.

Congratulations to those players that achieved milestones this year, including Rapheal Evalu, Fred du Plessis, Jack McAree, and Starsky Vaaulu all of whom notched up 100 games for the club.

A full rundown on the junior's year will be provided by the chair of our junior rugby committee, Michael Wilson. I would like to add my thank you to all involved in our junior rugby programs including the almost 500 players from U6 through to U18, all the coaches, managers, and wonderful families who give of their time to ensure the players are provided with a safe and enjoyable rugby environment. A special thank you to Ruth Lythall who took on the dual roles of Saturday and Sunday Vice Chair among her various other organizing activities this year.

Of course, on-field success can't happen without massive off field support. This includes all the coaches and managers involved but also our club doctor, Dr Marianna Zukiwskyj. She has offered her services week in week out, home, and away for 12 years. Thank you to our photographer Kev Nagle. He has been taking photos of Prems, Women, Colts, and other grades for 2 years now and gives us unlimited access to use them. He often attends games and training sessions for hours and his photos always receive a huge response on social media. Also, thank you to our ground announcer Danny Hoyland. A huge thank you to all from the club.

Thank you to our Director of Rugby this year, Toutai Kefu. He was able to manage the on and off field rugby across the club to ensure we had great success through the grades.

Thank you to our Club Manager Nicole Lauder for her efforts during another challenging year and thank you to our executive management committee, and senior and junior rugby committees. A special mention and thank you again to Chris Hourigan, Simon McNeven and Bob Hammond for all their great work on securing and implementing the many Government grant funded projects at the club this year. Thank you to our Federal Member Graham Perret MP, State Member Mark Bailey MP, and local councilor Cr Nicole Johnston for their support of the club.

Thank you to Bob Hammond, Bill Brammer, Michael Wilson and John Menilli for all their work in preparing our fields for training and play each week.

This year we were able to post an Operating Profit (before depreciation) of \$43,733 for the full year vs \$65,239 for prior year. Full details of our financial performance will be reported by our treasurer, Adam Day, including a more detailed evaluation of revenue and Government assistance packages that contributed to the profit.

Lastly, to our sponsors, a special thank you to our naming rights sponsor, the Index group, for 45 years of continuous sponsorship of Souths Rugby. ## Treasurer's Report

It is with pleasure that I present to members the audited financial statements for Souths Rugby Union Club Incorporated for the year ended 30 September 2021, on the accompanying pages. As detailed in the Profit and Loss Statements the club has posted an Operating Profit (before depreciation) of \$43,733 for the full year v. \$65,239 for prior year.

The Club's cash position at end of financial year was a total of \$362,010 cash on hand, made up of Term Deposits of \$307,416 and cash on hand of \$54,594.

The operations of the Rugby Club are such that it must maintain a level of cash surplus from one year to the next. This is to allow for the peaks and lows in its receipts and payments which generally are not timed the same, plus invest surplus cash for major equipment and facilities upgrades. A number of major and minor capital works projects were completed during the year, including the decision to upgrade the main field lighting at Chipsy Wood as part of the grant for lower field lighting upgrade and partial main field. It should be noted that since 2017 \$478,000 has been put into capital improvements and upgrades both at Chipsy Wood and Shaftesbury Street facilities with access to a number of Local, State & Federal Government grants and co-funded with club funds and many volunteer hours being put in. Below is a summary this year's major works completed.

As set out in the accompanying Profit and Loss Statement the gross revenues for the year totaled \$724,138 and expenditures of \$680,405 giving Operating Profit of \$43,733. A summary of the detailed report is provided below;

You will note that the club's gross revenue from trading (bars & retail operations) have turned around considerably, and this is a direct result of lifting of the COVID restrictions during 2021, although we did experience a four week loss of trade with one snap lockdown. Sponsorships and fundraising increased considerably with a \$30,000 distribution from Rugby AU via the Channel 9/STAN televising of premier grade round games.

Rugby expenditure had increased back in line with an almost full season of games being played compared to 2020, plus the additional funding of the Director of Rugby role and a general increase in the cost of player kit provided as a part of player membership. Additionally, there has been an increase in field repairs & maintenance of \$11,000 over 2021, this being the top dressing and aeration of all fields (3) this season.

Administration/overhead expenditures remained consistent with the prior year overall but a number of savings were lost with our increased water and utilities costs particularly with the long dry spells we experienced.

In closing, on behalf of the Club I must thank for their ongoing support our many dedicated supporters and volunteers plus our major sponsors and our Federal Member of Parliament Graham Perrett MP, State Member Mark Bailey MP, our local City Councillors Cr Nicole Johnston and Cr Krista Adams.

## Junior Rugby Committee Report

2021 was another strong year for Souths Junior Magpies with almost 500 boys and girls registered, plus 20 Modified Rugby Program (MRP) participants. This year also saw an increased number of registered coaches, managers and volunteers at 103, without whom the club would not operate as efficiently and effectively as we have seen throughout the season.

We have been very lucky that we were able to play for most of the season, albeit with a bit of a COVID pause in the middle, and we have again seen strong participation across all of the age groups; the sportsmanship and determination of all of the players keeping the spirit of the Souths Magpies alive.

Unfortunately however, as a result of COVID travel restrictions, for a second year in a row, we were unable to facilitate our annual Coogee Seahorse and Souths Magpie Tour for our Under 10, 11 and 12 year age groups. With restrictions easing at the end of this year, we hope to resume this nearly 50 year tradition in 2022.

COVID also impacted on our revenue during the year with the introduction of the hub approach for Saturday games, and the timing of COVID snap lockdowns meaning that Souths only had one full round of home games, with the second round cut-short with the announcement on 31 July, half way through the morning.

Notwithstanding, it was great to see the successful outcomes of the efforts for the season, with 6 of our teams qualifying to play in semi-final matches with 2 teams progressing to the finals. We secured one finals victory with our Under 13 Blacks taking out the Division 1 Premiership in a great game against a strong Brothers team. The Junior Colts lost in a tight game against Brothers after securing a win in the Lightning Series earlier in the year with arguably one of the best defensive efforts.

Of course, all of this doesn't happen without the collective efforts of many, and there are a number of people to be acknowledged.

**Ruth Lythall** had the dual role of both Saturday and Sunday Vice Chair this year, which historically was split between two people. Always at Souths every Friday night and Sunday home games, Ruth is always there to organise volunteers or whatever else is required. The amount of work done behind the scenes is astronomical and I wouldn't have made it through this season without her support.

**Daffyd Griffiths** as Junior Registrar is busy at the start and continues to sort out issues throughout the entire season. His easy-going demeanor and attention to detail is critical in this role and the personal time he always invests to ensure all is in order is greatly appreciated.

**Nicole Lauder** as Club Manager works tirelessly to help the Juniors with getting ready for the season and help preparing each week for training night and game days. Nicole works especially hard and goes above and beyond at Friday night training.

The Souths Committee for working behind the scenes to improve facilities and help keep our sign-on fees down.

**Field Maintenance** including John Menilli, Bob Hammond and Billy Brammer for volunteering hours of their time to keep both of the Souths fields and amenities looking good, clean and tidy for the season.

## Head Coach Report

The 2021 Season was one of near misses, outstanding performances and then inexplicable lapses. Frustrating is a word to describe the season.

After a successful preseason, which saw the grades split into 2 distinct groups, the boys focused on their conditioning & skills. It was a hugely successful time with some players emerging from the shadows of the lower grades to stake their claim up top. Players like Lachie McBrearty & Paora-nui Touariki come to mind immediately.

We played a non-traditional Compass Cup Preseason with wins coming against Norths, Bond Uni and Wests. While these were only trials there were glimpses of the capacity of this team and where we are headed.

Our 1st Round was notable for a number of reasons,

- Blue Cards (Head Knock Suspensions)
- Injuries
- Close losses

The close losses came in the form of 4 games that were Bonus Point games for losing by 7 points of less. On 3 games a combined total of 11 points separated the Souths Team from their opponent. This is a "disease" that must be fixed moving into 2022... We must win the close ones if we are to fulfil our true potential.

In Round 1 Two games standout for me;

1) UQ @ Souths

After losing 3 players to Blue Cards in the first 8 minutes, the team had fallen behind to a 0-14 start to a full strength UQ (6 Super Rugby Players). This on any day is a deficit to UQ that would be hard to erase. However our players not only steadied the ship but surged! For the next 50 minutes Souths went on a 28-7 Scoring run. This ended when Winger turned Centre snapped two bones in his leg in the act of setting up a critical try. The ensuing 9 minute medical stoppage did not help... Our momentum was gone & UQ were able to fashion two late tries to finally emerge 35-28 Victors... This was a sign of the capacity this group has.

2) Bond Uni @ Bond

Our team displayed all elements of the game. The forwards were able to gain control of the game and that allowed our backs/attack to fully express itself. 7 tries were scored and the fashion in which they were scored was the exciting part for the club. Two late tries while we were trying to continue to play allowed the score line to get closer than what the game actually was.

The second round proved to again challenge our playing group. What it did show was that the depth within the club is growing. At 1 stage throughout Round 2 we had 11 Premier Grade standard players unavailable

due to injury, while this is difficult to overcome, the experience & opportunity it provided to players to step up was invaluable and should serve the individuals plus the club extremely well in the coming seasons.

2021 had many highlights and as a club we should be extremely proud of our entire club's progress. The undeniable fact is that Premier Grade left too many wins out on the field, they started to put themselves in positions to win these games... The challenge now is to take that next step. 2022 is a critical season for this core group of young men, we have no doubt they will rise up to this challenge.

#### A few thankyous must be said;

Cian O'Connor – who steps down (I think up) as the team's senior assistant coach and in as the head of our Colts program. Cian has been an invaluable asset, coach and sparring partner to me over the last two seasons. His approach to the game & players is exactly what this club needs.... I have absolutely zero doubt that success will follow him and the club will be richer for him taking ownership of our most critical area.

Darren Rees – Reesy has been a massive contributor to our coaching team, taking on set piece coaching. Reesy provides the team with passion & understanding of the harder edge to this game. He is a proud Souths man with each player's best interests at heart. We are very lucky to have Reesy around the group.

Luke Samoa – The retiring Premier Grade Captain has been with the club 2 seasons, yet it feels like a lifetime. Luke's influence on this young group will be felt into the next decade. With many of these young lads benefiting from his experience and leadership. We are thrilled Luke will be joining Cian as a key contributor to our ongoing commitment to Colts rugby at Souths. Luke also now heads up the 7s program & the results speak for themselves. Luke, thanks for trusting me & I am so very excited to see you continue to contribute to the club in your new coaching roles.

To Dave, Matty & Rowdy... What a year! It was absolutely stunning to see the reserve grade lads get their just desserts for a strong season. This is truly a sign that the club is in great hands and our continued focus on building depth is working. I am sure no one will forget in a hurry the last 10 minutes vs UQ in that final!

To the Club Board & Rugby Committee, we value your ongoing support of the way in which we have committed to rebuilding the grades from the bottom up. It is a frustrating process at stages but one that is starting to bear fruit. With 2nd – 6th Grade making finals, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3rd, 4th & 6th Grade making the Grand Finals, it is a sign that our commitment to development and a full club approach is well underway.

Finally to Nicole Lauder, Nifty & Soxy. Your work behind the scenes is never not valued or missed. Teams and clubs do not run without the help and dedication of people like yourselves. As a club we are lucky to have you all.
